This year's GeoFair theme is "Celebrating 250 years of America's Minerals & Fossils" so visitors will enjoy exceptional and rare specimens of amazing minerals and marvelous fossils encompassing our nation's history.

Admission to GeoFair is \$12 for adults and \$5 for children. (Free admission is offered to uniformed Scouts, to qualifying 4-H members, and to teachers with identification and a paid adult companion.) A two-day adult pass is available for \$18. (A coupon for \$2 off adult admission may be downloaded at www.GeoFair.Com) Admission discounts for groups larger than 10 are available. The Butler County Fairgrounds offer abundant free parking.

Since 1965, GeoFair has introduced thousands of families to the pleasures of the earth sciences including collecting minerals and fossils, making jewelry and studying geology and paleontology. Dozens of displays showcase the rare specimens of amateur collectors. At GeoFair, more than 40 commercial vendors from as far away as Florida and Nevada will offer stunning treasures for sale, ranging from curiosities costing mere pennies to museum-quality specimens costing thousands of dollars.
